


How to Make a Web Map with the Jr. SeaDocs Layers

Accessing the Layers


We have created a group of layers that correspond to different parts of the Junior SeaDoctors curriculum. These layers are all in an ArcGIS Online group. You should be sent a link to join the group. Once you're in the group, the layer options will all be visible.

Creating a Map

Once you're signed into ArcGIS Online, navigate to the "Map" heading.




Once you're in the mapping screen it will look like this:




To add a new layer press “Add” and then “Search for Layers”


Where it says “My Content” press the drop down menu.




Choose “My Groups.” All of the layers from the Jr. SeaDocs group should show up in the sidebar.


Once you choose the layer that you want added to the map, you can click the name and the information, a preview, and the option to add to the map will pop up.



Press "Add to Map" and the layer will appear in the map!




Once the layer is added, you can go back to the “Details” sidebar. Under “Content” it will list all the layers you have on your map. The check mark next to each layer controls whether or not you want the layer to be visible on your map. By pressing the 3 dots on the side of each layer’s name, you can remove the layer completely.




In order to save the map, you can press the save menu above the map. Press “save as” in order to rename the map to something you will remember. ArcGIS Online will make you add a tag when you save the map. Tag it as something related to the curriculum!

When you come back into ArcGIS Online at a later time you can find your saved map by going to the Content page.



Under content you can see all your personal content and the maps that you've made and saved, as well as all the content within your groups.



Your map should be under “My Content”

When reopening the map it will take you to a description screen. From there you can edit who the map is shared with, open it, edit it, and write a short description.
